OVERVIEW

The Gardener assists with the maintenance of landscaping and will establish and maintain a historic kitchen garden. Volunteers will have the opportunity to showcase their green thumb, working amongst the historic oil fields which surround the museum.

COMMITMENT

- Make a minimum commitment of 1 year
- Be available spring through fall for 2 hours per week, as needed

TRAINING

- Attend museum orientation
- Review of Volunteer Handbook for policies and procedures

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist with the upkeep of current landscaping
- Planting, watering, mulching, and weeding
- Create and maintain historic kitchen garden near log cabin
- Harvest produce, as needed

QUALIFICATIONS

- Interpersonal and communication skills
- Ability to meet physical requirements of the role (bend, lift, kneel, and squat)
- Ability to work independently and in a team setting
- Knowledge of native/historic plants is an asset

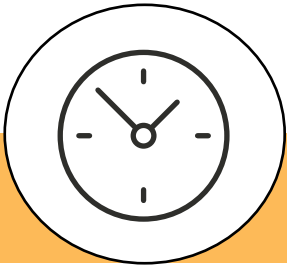
